Sometimes, art is very organic and collaborations feel very natural. As is the case for Kent based artisans, Stevenson Brothers Rocking Horses and contemporary artist, Mr Doodle.

Marc Stevenson and Mr Doodle met in May 2025 at RHS Chelsea Flower Show. The pair soon realised that they share the same passion for art, went to the same art school in Bristol and live close to one another in the Tenterden area of Kent.

The vision to create a doodled rocking horse quickly became clear and **the very first Mr Doodle x Stevenson Brothers Rocking Horse** is being revealed at **Gallery 8** in the St James's area of London on 31st March 2026.

This is a unique piece; a large Tulip Wood rocking horse on an Oak base with black patent leather saddle & tack and a secret locking compartment. Doodled and signed by Mr Doodle at his studio. FACT FILE: STEVENSON BROTHERS ROCKING HORSES

Established October 1982 at Finn Farm in Ashford by twin brothers, Marc & Tony Stevenson

Over 10,000 rocking horses made to date

Specialist team includes an in-house saddler, painters, sanders, rocking horse restoration specialists

Each rocking horse is made to order

Rocking horse replicas of real horses are particularly popular. Some clients choose to use their own horse's saddle and tack, mount one of their shoes on the base and include some of their tail or mane hair

Also popular are classics like the Dapple Grey and Waxed Oak along with the more modern Cowboy Horse, Rocking Zebra and Rocking Unicorn

The Rocking Horse Hospital at the workshop repairs and restores antique rocking horses

The late Queen Elizabeth II was presented with 6 of these rocking horses to mark milestones in her reign such as BARBERSHOP (right) for her Platinum Jubilee





FACT FILE: MR DOODLE

Real name: Sam Cox

Contemporary artist known for his "graffiti spaghetti" style and dense, monochromatic, hand-drawn doodles covering large surfaces.

Studied at Homewood School & Sixth Form Centre.

Mr Doodle often wears his own hand-drawn clothing and fully embodies the "Mr Doodle" persona, as given to him by a tutor at the University of the West of England in Bristol. This is where both he and Marc Stevenson studied art and design, although in different decades!

Gained millions of social media followers when he turned his Tenterden home into a fully doodled, 12-room, interactive artwork piece over two years.

He credits artists Keith Haring and Banksy as inspirations as well as video game, Crash Bandicoot.

His goal is to "create a happy visual doodle language" that is accessible and fun, focusing on themes of love and playfulness rather than political messages.
